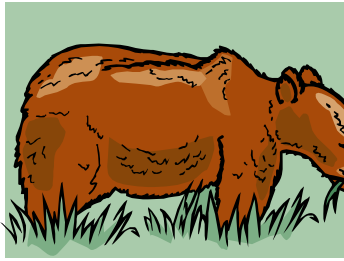


# Learning Lighthouse Preschool Newsletter

There is a famous book called Brown Bear, Brown Bear What Do You See? that helps children learn their colors and also how to re-tell a story. We started My Color Book this week with the colors brown and red. For "brown day" we decorated our brown bear with anything brown we could find and glue. We played "I Spy Brown", Hot Potato and also found some "mud" to stick our ooey gooey hands in. For "red day" we glued red feather to our bird, found and counted red bears and blocks and q-tip painted a heart red. We also learned how to play "Red Rover, Red Rover."
